"Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men"

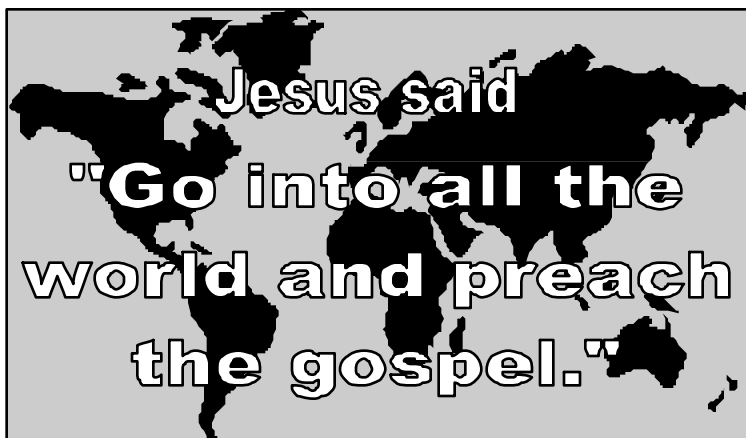
Mathew 4:19

On Track for a Family Reunion

Josh and his wife Tiffany lived in the far western deserts of China for almost 4 years. They now reside in Texas but still carry an unexplained passion for the Chinese people.

My wife and I hadn't spent a holiday with our family in over three years. While living in China we had only been to a church building twice and when we phoned home we were careful never to say the words "God", "Jesus" or "Bible".

It was certainly difficult living in Xinjiang, China's most remote and politically sensitive province, but we knew that God had called us there. The first year our movements had been followed closely by local police and we had been warned that our communications could also be monitored. For this reason we were careful never to say certain "Christian" words over the phone or in email.

We quickly adapted to this minor inconvenience, but what was harder was being so distant from family and friends. Being geographically isolated made us cherish all the more the moments we had with our families, so when my parents called saying they were willing to make the lengthy trip to visit us we were ecstatic!

It wouldn't be an easy trip. We needed to get from the

eastern port city of Shanghai, where they would first arrive, all the way to the capital of our province, the same distance from New York to Seattle. We knew an airplane would have been fast but we didn't care about time. We just wanted to have the opportunity to fellowship together, so we decided that the best place to begin our family reunion would be on a train.

Although many berth options were available, we decided to buy tickets for an entire cabin with four beds and a small table. After we had packed away a bundle of games and an entire bag full of food, we were ready to go. Late one night we boarded the Chinese train and settled in for the 46-hour rail ride to our home in China.

Nothing quite reunites a family like spending two days cramped in a tiny train compartment, but we loved it! My wife and I were finally able to tell stories about what God had done in our small desert town; about the underground churches we had attended and the Chinese people we had watched come to know Christ. These were the same stories that were too risky for us to share over

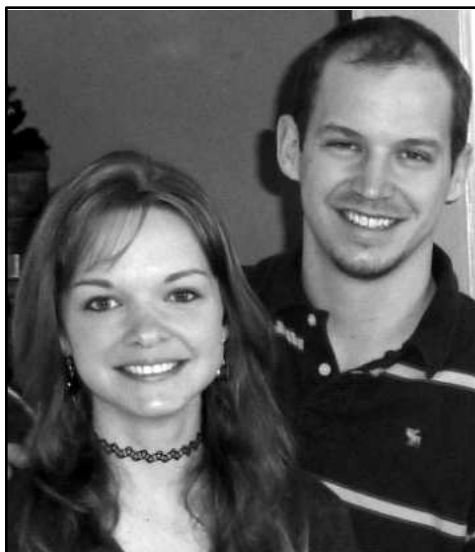
the phone or internet for fear of being discovered by a government that doesn't look kindly upon missionaries.

Likewise my parents talked for hours describing all of the events that we had missed over the past few years being away. Pictures were passed around and laughs were exchanged, all to the soothing sway of a fast-moving train.

Meanwhile the scenery outside the small train window was slowly shifting every hour we traveled. At first all we could see were tall skyscrapers and industrial buildings, but soon that changed to small houses and sprawling farms. In some parts of the country we saw snow while in others parched land. Once we began to reach the desert oasis not far from our home province the scenery switched yet again to rolling sand dunes and never-ending sky. At one point we even passed a herd of camels grazing nearby the tracks to our south.

For some families being huddled together for 46 hours in cramped quarters might be challenging, but God was good to us. This journey ended up being one of the most memorable adventures we've shared as a family.

During our train reunion we also had the wonderful opportunity to join hands and pray. Together we thanked God for keeping us safe while being apart as well as for the chance to reunite. And when we were finished we proudly closed our prayer with four simple words that the seclusion on this train made possible: In **Jesus'** name, Amen.

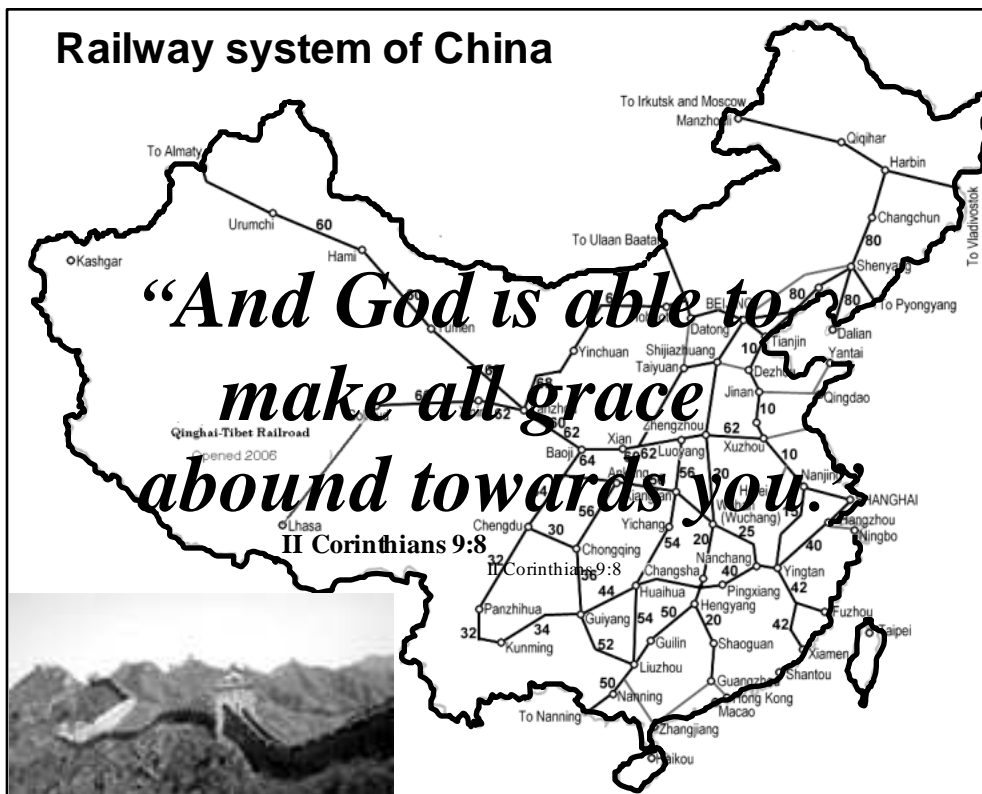
A new frontier for Railway ministries

The Rolf & Irena Wilhelm Story Switzerland

Rolf passes many railroad switches each day in his locomotive. They remind him of his switched direction, which brought him a new quality of life – a life with God!



The following is an account of a series of incidents as told to Hans Ueli Beereuter of Switzerland (www.textlive.ch) by Rolf Wilhelm, President of Switzerland's Christian Transport Fellowship **RailHope** (www.railhope.ch), and translated by Elisabeth Andreetti, IRM secretary.

One day, as Engineer Rolf Wilhelm was pulling a train through Affoltern am Albis, a canton of Zurich, a freight train loaded with logs suddenly appeared on the tracks ahead. Rolf immediately grabbed the emergency stop lever and sounded the train horn. But the freight train rolling toward him had no locomotive, and no brakes. There was no way of stopping it. At the last possible moment Rolf ran toward the back of his train. The two trains collided, and although both trains were heavily damaged no one was seriously injured, due in part to the relatively slow speed at which they were travelling. It was a close call.

The accident near Zurich was the beginning of a whole series of disasters in Rolf's career as an engineer. Once he was almost crushed between two moving locomotives in a shunting area. A locomotive drove past a "stop" signal, crashed into another engine and tipped over. Rolf again was miraculously unharmed.

The very same day, a railroad crossing barrier operator left the barriers up as Rolf and his train came thundering down the tracks toward the crossing. Rolf's speedometer showed that he was travelling nearly 70 miles per hour as people walked through the open crossing, unaware of the danger. Rolf managed to bring the train to a stop just before it reached the crossing the people were walking through. Mere seconds had saved their lives.

Rolf and his train continued on. But at the next station, he was stopped because his locomotive was on fire. The full stop at the crossing had ignited some grease on the outside of the brakes. The fire was quickly extinguished. A few weeks later Rolf's train nearly collided with a construction train. It turned out that after a railroad repair a switch was wired incorrectly, and both trains had the green light to use the track. It was obvious to Rolf that God was watching over him during these incidents. After the collision at Affoltern Rolf donated 500 Swiss francs to his church in gratitude for his safety, and continued to donate after each incident.

Rolf Wilhelm's marriage was anything but stable from the beginning. His wife Irena wanted to enjoy life after they got married. She was raised in a strict Catholic home and was not allowed to do some of the things that her friends could. When she finally escaped the strong control of her parents, she let loose. She wanted to have fun - dancing, parties, travelling. The couple lived almost exclusively for themselves. They had no children. Rolf had grown up in

poverty and now wanted to enjoy the things his money could buy. "We earned a lot. We both had good jobs, and we also helped Irena's parents with their construction company". They could afford almost anything they wanted - elegant clothes, expensive jewellery, beautiful furniture and long expensive vacations.

Marital fidelity was not taken very seriously either. Both of them had their private lives also, after all. But when Irena moved out one day and moved in with another man, the situation started to grow more and more out of control. Her new partner was violent toward her, and the police were called more than once. Rolf also had a girlfriend. Yet Irena was frequently coming back home to discuss things and to talk with Rolf.

Rolf fell into a state of depression. The mental strain was becoming unbearable. He wanted Irena back. For years the Bible had been lying there beside his bed, gathering dust. Rolf picked it up, and as he started to read, his eyes were opened. He started to realize that the life he had been living was wrong. As he began to pray he felt a peacefulness come into his troubled soul.

The Christian faith was not unknown to Rolf. As children, his mother sent him and his sisters to a United Methodist Church, where they attended Sunday School and joined a youth group. Rolf joined in, but never really believed in God's love and strength.

Irena was also getting desperate. She was spiralling out of control. Her self-centered ways had destroyed her life and her relationships. She suffered from anorexia, and her weight dropped down below 80 pounds. Her love affair didn't empower her in any way. On the contrary, she was torn. She and Rolf had known each other as children, and as neighbourhood kids had played together. Rolf knew as a boy that he wanted to marry this girl some day, and eventually his dream was fulfilled. They had been in love, but now all the love seemed to have vanished. - Continued on page 7

He followed the advice of his sister. "Just read the New Testament". The words of the Bible, some of which he remembered from his Sunday School classes as a youth, began to dominate his life. Now the words all suddenly came alive, like never before! Rolf fell to his knees and turned his life over to Jesus. As he set a new course, God's will gained in importance, and God's forgiveness began to reshape Rolf's life. Rolf had been reading the Christian Transport Fellowship's (**RailHope**) newsletter, shared with him regularly by one of his friends. He was so impressed by the testimonials in it that, in the midst of his difficult times, Rolf promised to God: "I'm going to get involved with the Christian railroad workers if Irena comes back home again". And then Irena came back! The violence of her partner had driven her back to her husband.

But Irena did not remain faithful. Unwilling to deal with the stress any longer, Rolf told her plainly: "Tomorrow you can leave for good. I refuse to live like this any longer!" Irena realized that now her relationship with Rolf was probably over. She begged him for one last chance. She sought the guidance of a young pastor who had visited the Wilhelms and helped the couple regain some of the ground they had lost in their relationship. Three months later Irena too decided to give her life a new direction. She enrolled in a twelve-month course entitled "Faith Steps" at the Methodist Church. The more Irena learned about God, the more her life improved. She sought God wholeheartedly. The church became a new "home" for Rolf and Irena. Rolf's life also improved greatly. Today he knows it was God's presence that changed his life. "Earlier my life was a rat race. I loved money and thought constantly about what I could buy with it. Today I still like beautiful things, but I don't crave them like I did before". They learned to be content with what they had, without constantly wanting more and more. They now feel a deep sense of peace and security.

In the past eleven years Rolf and Irena have experienced God's love over and over. When important decisions have to be made, they know that they are being guided by God's hand to make the right choices. Their feelings and thoughts align more and more as the years go by. They may not always agree, but through faith they always find a common path. "Our happiness is not in material things, but in God"

Irena has taken various theological, psychological and pastoral courses, and has put her abilities to use helping people. She has a ministry in her Christian community and visits and supports women with difficult life situations. Through education she has cultivated her talent in management and organization.

Rolf and Irena's lives are very different today. They recently booked a vacation away from home. "It was awesome. We were perfectly happy. Money is nothing if life is only fixed on one's ego". Rolf passes many railroad switches each day in his locomotive. They remind him of his switched direction, which brought him a new quality of life – a life with God!

Minnesota Railroad Fellowship

May 8, 2010 was an historic day – America's First NATIONAL TRAIN DAY. It was also the day that the "Trainman" and two locomotive engineers launched the Twin Cities Chapter of the REA, naming it the MN RAILROAD FELLOWSHIP. "We are located in MN – so we adopted the name Meeting Needs through Railroad Fellowship. Amtrak allowed us to distribute multiple copies of ALL ABOARD at the depot where all the National Train Day festivities were being held. We set up an attractive display at the Twin Cities Model RR Club's semi-annual train show held at the MN State Fairgrounds. Rev. Steve Seidler, 'The Trainman' and ALL ABOARD MR/Rail Fan Editor made the sign and brought along working miniature crossbucks and his G-scale model of the Northern Pacific train that pulled Boston W. Smith's first Chapel Car, 'The Evangel.' It drew a lot of attention. Two locomotive engineers exhibited their enthusiasm for sharing the Gospel by helping to man the display. Mark Lorenz, CP (his testimony appears in this issue) and John Stewart, BNSF (his testimony will appear in the next issue) found out about REA through picking up a copy of ALL ABOARD left at local Hobby Shop. Mark and John are now eager to share the Gospel with their fellow railroaders. We solicited names for our new fellowship among railroad personnel, model railroaders, and rail fans of all ages. We passed out hundreds of ALL ABOARDS (as well as every back issue we had), and personally handed a Gospel tract to everyone that entered the train show. The 'Trainman' talked to a lot of children as well as answering parent's questions. Now we are looking for a permanent meeting location."

Saint Paul, Minnesota, situated on the banks of the Mississippi River and smaller city to her twin, Minneapolis, was originally called "Pig's Eye." As the state capital grew it changed its name, but the railroad activity in South Saint Paul retained the name and the **SOO LINE** facility was called Pig's Eye Yard. The **CANADIAN PACIFIC RWY.** now owns and operates this yard. One of the locomotive engineers working out of this yard discovered that there are other Christian railroaders. That discovery was made reading an ALL ABOARD picked up at a local hobby shop. That engineer is **Mark Lorenz** and he is excited to see a fellowship begin in the Twin Cities to support his efforts to witness to railroaders. Here is the truth of the Word of God in edited personal testimony from **Mark** himself:

"My story goes like this. I was raised a Catholic and had an average religious upbringing, but I always felt like it was something I HAD TO DO. I got involved and weekly participated in all the rituals. It was something I just did, but I never really felt like I was connected to God or that He had any special concern for me. As I grew up and could make my own choices, I chose to leave the church. I thought I could do a better job on my own relating to God. That did not happen! Oh, I believed in my mind and heart that there was a god...there had to be! I believed that Jesus walked on earth but my belief was limited to a historical knowledge."

"I never became addicted to anything or hit rock bottom, turning to the LORD when there were no other options. I didn't get in trouble with the law and no desperate situation forced me to look finally upon the face of the LORD. No, I had a relatively comfortable existence. I always had food to eat and was able to work. I possessed many things that brought me happiness...at least for a while. I had dreams and plenty of time to live them out."

(Continued from page 8) I was right where Satan wanted me. The search began for me in earnest some time after I finished college. I had just been married, bought a new house, and was well on my way to a successful career in retail management. I was visiting my very smart brother in Colorado. He has a genius level IQ, but science is his religion. We were having a discussion about God. He explained to me why he didn't believe and I explained why I did. I remember telling him that who I am as a person (my being) is not a physical thing. There is not a part of me that you could remove that would take away who I am. To me I knew that that spirit, that intangible thing that is me, has to be able to exist on some other plane when my body ceases to carry it. I knew that this was still a long way from a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, but it was a beginning."

"Before knowing Jesus Christ as my Savior, I did not have to suffer through adversity. I did, however, have to overcome complacency. That, I think, is sometimes the hardest thing to overcome. I thank the LORD for never forsaking me and being right behind me when I turned to face Him."

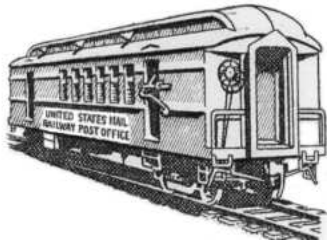
"The years since then have been an amazing journey of faith. As I have studied the Word and grown in my walk, I have felt compelled to serve. I joined the Canadian Pacific Railroad in 2003 and have loved it from the beginning. I have often said that I think it is what I was born to do. I am a locomotive engineer. In many ways it is a very demanding job and unlike any other. We work on call. We travel out of town. We cannot plan anything because you never know if you will be in town or off work when you need to be. It has interfered with regular fellowship and I caused me to think that maybe I needed to leave so God could use me somewhere else.

As I started to think about leaving the railroad, I attended training for Disaster Relief Chaplains. There I met a man who was a corporate chaplain. It then occurred to me that maybe God could use me right where I was and shortly thereafter I was elected as our union's chaplain. I began an outreach to my fellow railroaders. We are encouraging each other and as a result people are being bolder with their witness. We have set up several Bible studies and are in the process of beginning a monthly fellowship. **PRAISE GOD FOR ALL HE HAS DONE!"**

"Then I decided to look a little harder for God. Once the search began all kinds of other distractions came into play. My marriage fell apart and I started having trouble at work. Soon my whole life was in turmoil. I knew I had to seek God even harder. I decided I needed to be in fellowship with other believers, so I joined a church to seek out others who would help me in my spiritual quest. God sent an incredible woman into my life. We were long-time friends, but she had been saved as a child. When we started dating we both decided that God was going to be the center of our relationship. We attended church together and met some incredible people who supported us along the way. She was instrumental in helping me get to a place where I would hear the Gospel. Shortly after our son was born in 2001, I accepted Christ as my Savior. We have been through a lot together, but each challenge brings us closer together and closer to God. We have faced a lot of adversity over the years. My faith has been shaken at times, but God sees me through it all. I learn to trust Him more and more each day."

Frank T. Wilson

A 100 year old railroad man given "Key to the City"

Today my husband, Paul Campbell, and I, Geneva, had the privilege of visiting with a 100 year old railroad man, Frank T. Wilson. Frank was born on May 30th, 1910 in Strasburg, Virginia. In honor of Frank's 100th birthday, the mayor of the city of Strasburg proclaimed that May 30th be known as "Frank T. Wilson Day" and gave Mr. Wilson the "Key to the City" for the day.

At the age of 17, Frank started working for the Southern Railroad in Strasburg. After working for 4 years in the local rail yards, Frank became eligible to help fire up the old steam engines. He worked his way up to Flagman, and then to Passenger Conductor. Frank began his railroad career earning 58 cents per day for a 16 hour day! (The Silk Mill paid better wages, a whole dollar for a mere 12 hour day). He recalled the time when, while riding on locomotive Engine #47, he saw up ahead on the tracks a "sun kink". This is a very dangerous condition when, in extremely hot climates, the rails expand in length so much that they have no choice but to warp and buckle. Frank pulled the air brake, stopping the train and saving many lives that day.

Frank retired after 34 years with the railroad, and still lives in Strasburg. He lives by himself now, but has a daughter who lives next door, and a policeman son who lives only ½ block away. He is well looked after. Frank's mind is still very sharp, and we enjoyed talking about "old times" and all the buddies that he and Paul Campbell worked with through the years on the Southern Railroad.

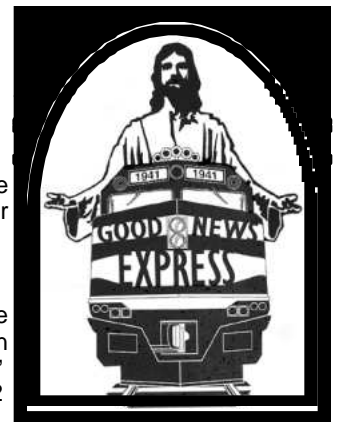

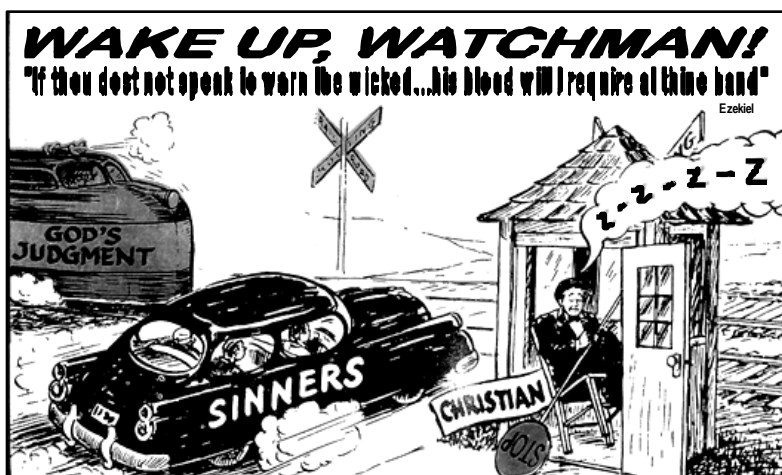

words of Jesus and what the Bible says what we must do to escape the judgment of God as depicted in the old REA gospel tract to the left.

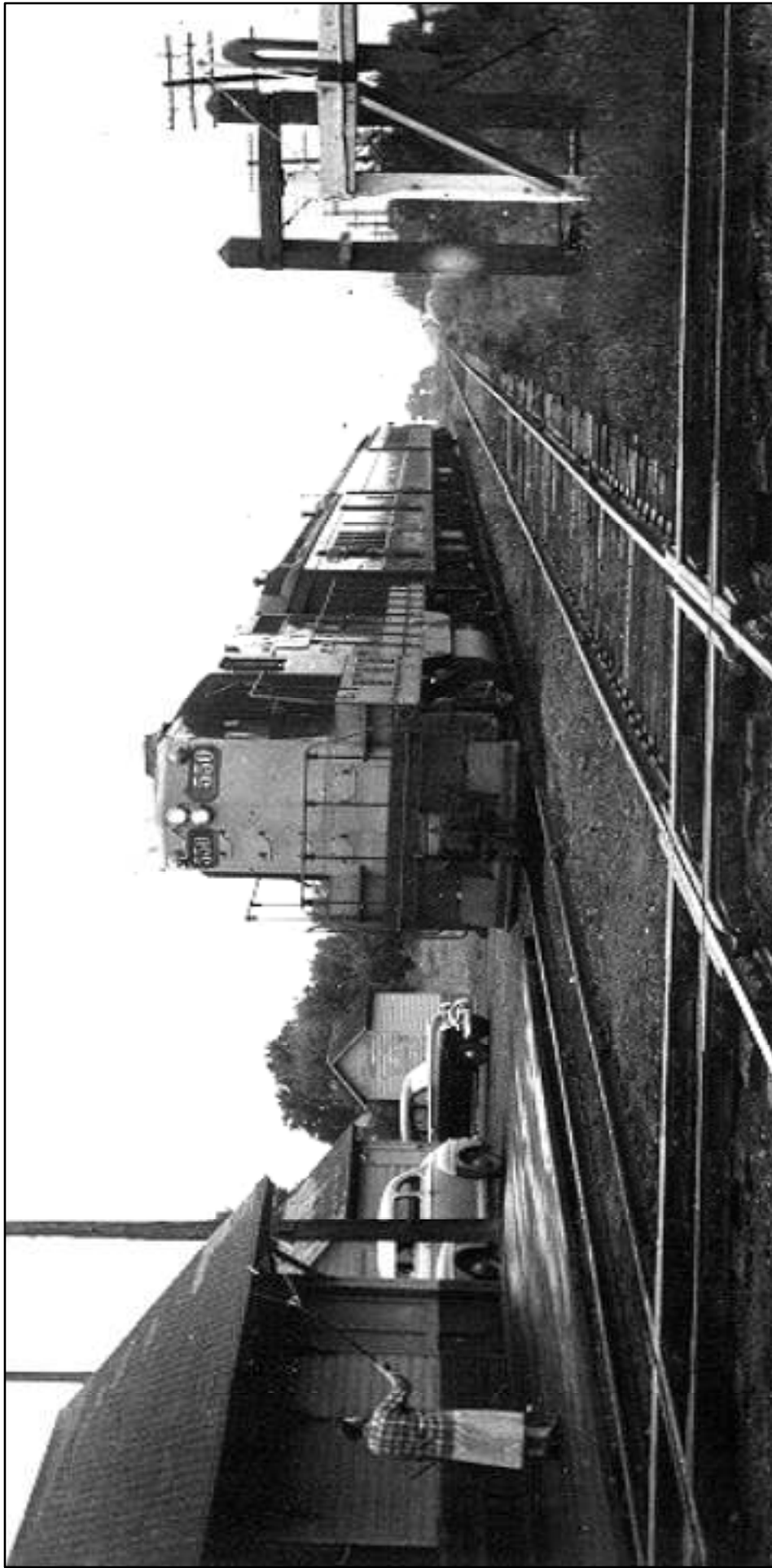
