But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him".



The **SOO LINE** coupled a pair of EMD, SW9s to work the Twin Ports in the 1980s. These switchers were built in the fall of 1953. No. 2118 was lettered for the Zenith City, "Duluth," and No. 2119 for her sister city, "Superior." As they were MU'ed, the locos were tireless workers on both sides of Saint Louis Bay. CANINE RAILWAY MAIL CARRIER

On July 27, 2011 in Washington DC, the U.S. Postal Service unveiled a stamp dedicated to "Owney," a stray dog who became the mascot of the Railway Mail Service late in the 19th century. The terrier mix appears on the stamp in a painting by artist Bill Bond of Arlington, Virginia.

The real-life Owney was a stray dog who wandered into the Albany, New York, post office in 1888, where postal clerks took a liking to him. The clerks let him stay the night, and he fell asleep on a pile of empty mailbags. Owney began to ride with the bags

on Railway Post Office (RPO) train cars across the state . . . and then the country! He followed mailbags onto trains and began riding with them across the country. The Railway Mail Service was a dangerous business at that time, but legend says no harm came to workers on the trains Owney rode.


The RPO clerks adopted Owney as their unofficial mascot, marking his travels by placing medals and tags from his stops on his collar. Railway mail clerks considered the dog Owney a good luck charm. At a time when train wrecks were all too common, no train Owney rode was ever in a wreck. The Railway mail clerks adopted Owney as their unofficial mascot, marking his travels by placing medals and tags on his collar. Each time Owney returned home to Albany, the clerks there saved the tags. Owney was known throughout the world for his journeys. He began to travel extensively around the United States after befriending the post office clerks in Albany. Owney visited small towns as well as large metropolises in nearly every state as he accompanied mailbags being carried by the Railway Mail Service. His international travels were hallmarked by his trip around the world in 1895, which was sponsored by the postal clerks.

An 1895 New York Times article described how Owney's journeys began: "When the mail is sent to the station, Owney jumps on the wagon, and stays there until the last bag is thrown into the car. If he feels like taking a journey, he then jumps aboard the car, barks good-bye, and away he goes. Once on the train he is the guest of the clerks at the railway post office along the road."

Owney's body is preserved at the Smithsonian Institution's National Postal Museum. A group of postal employees raised money for Owney to be preserved. In 1904 the Department included Owney in its section of the World's Fair exposition in St. Louis, Missouri. In honor of Owney's presence at the fair, a group of Cleveland, Ohio, postal clerks commissioned a souvenir spoon designed for Owney. The design, produced by the Webb C. Ball Company, shows a railway train car in the bowl of the spoon and an illustration of Owney along with his name on the handle.

BUDD ZEPHYR UPDATE: Additional information was supplied on my picture of the "Flying Yankee" Zephyr, (rear cover of **ALL ABOARD**, Winter 2011) by **REA** member Carl Somme of Berlin, NH. Carl was involved with the initial stages of its restoration at Glen, NH. This Zephyr was brought from Edaville on Cape Cod, close to 200 miles, on 4 or 5 flatbed semi-trailers. It was acquired by Bob Morell, owner of "Story Land" and "Heritage" in Glen. Some work was done there, but completed at the Concord & Claremont shops in Claremont, NH. The initial run was in 2009. It was turned over to the State of New Hampshire as a historical item. The restoration was privately funded. As the "Flying Yankee" it ran from Boston to Portland to Bangor, ME. It also ran as the "Mountaineer" from Boston to the White Mts. in New Hampshire. In its day it amassed close to 3,000,000 miles! It has been pictured in a variety of railroad publications. It was definitely something to be preserved historically.

The BUDD stainless-steel Zephyrs were the railroads answer to compete against highways and airways in the 1930s. "Zephyr" is in honor of the Greek God of the WEST WIND. The CB&Q "Pioneer Zephyr" #9900 with its Winton 201 A diesel-electric motive power averaged 112-mph on its inaugural run from Denver to Chicago. 9 Burlington Zephyrs were built. The "Pioneer Zephyr," after appearing at the Great Chicago Railroad Fair (see **ALL ABOARD**, Spring 2011), was brought to the Museum of Science & Industry in Chicago in 1960. It is a fully interpretive exhibit upon entrance to the museum. The RPO section built into the engine unit is a unique feature of the Zephyrs.







Stephen Seidler of this EMD #5771, resplendent in Denver & Rio Grande yellow with black and silver trim, is working hard to lift the "California Zephyr" from Denver into the Rockies. Almost to the Moffat Tunnel, she is captured in the South Boulder Creek Valley west of Tunnel 29 at Pinecliffe. CO - 37.04 miles west of Denver at an elevation of 7,966 feet. Steve Seidler got this 35mm shot in the late 1970s, by hiking down from Colorado highway 72 to doubletrackside where there is a long passing siding. The photo was shot at Pinecliffe, CO, just off Highway 72, and west of Tunnel 28. There were originally 30 tunnels on the route from Denver to Moffat Tunnel, Tunnels 9 and 23 no longer exist, so

though there is a tunnel 29 and 30, only 28 tunnels can be counted today. The motto of the DR&G was "Thru the Rockies...Not around them." West of Denver the Moffat Route leaves the Great Plains and begins travelling up the massive Front Range escarpment of the Rocky Mts. Tracks wind their way up South Boulder Creek thru extremely rugged and remote canyons, snaking thru 28 tunnels, as the trains climb 3,000 feet of elevation in 40 miles.




called and said he wanted to start receiving 10 issue of each publication.
